[B] **(THE) MEDICAL TERMINATION OF PREGNANCY ACT, 1971**

[ACT, NO. 34 of 1971]

[10TH August, 1971]

An Act to provide for the termination of certain pregnancies by registered medical practitioners and for matters connected or incidental thereto.

Be it enacted by the Parliament in the Twenty-second year of the Republic of India as follows:

1. Short title, extent and commencement: -

- (1) This Act may be called the Medical Termination of Pregnancy Act, 1971
- (2) It extends to the whole of India except the State of Jammu & Kashmir.
